Pastor Puls' Reflection... Discipleship

Imagine the Lord Jesus Christ striding into your place of work, or walking into your living room. He smiles at you. He looks you in the eye. In a serious, yet warm, tone of voice, he says to you, "Follow me." Two simple words, but those words are suddenly flooding your brain, stirring your emotions, nudging your heart. Then Jesus turns and walks out of the room.

What happens next?

Back in first-century Galilee, several fishermen, a tax collector, and a few others had that exact same experience. Peter, James, John, Matthew, and eight others became the first disciples of Jesus Christ. They *followed* the Lord! Jesus invited them to literally walk with him every day, and to leave behind their old ways of living. By following Jesus as disciples, those men came to know God in a new and better way. They even participated actively in the divine mission of bringing Good News to the people of the world.

Today, in twenty-first-century North Carolina, you can have that same experience. Whether you are a teacher, an office worker, a retiree, a stay-at-home parent, or a complete slacker, Jesus is calling you to a life of discipleship. He wants you to *follow* him! Jesus invites you to walk with him daily, to leave behind your old ways of living, to get to know God in a more personal and meaningful way, and to actively share in the mission of spreading the Good News.

This fall at Hope we are going to explore, in depth, what it means for twenty-first-century Christians to be disciples of Jesus. Starting on September 6-7, and continuing each weekend in the months of September, October, and November, we're going to be studying and learning together about discipleship. We're not going to be jamming anything down your throat. Our goal is to challenge you to respond to Christ's discipleship call in healthy, faithful, empowering ways. After all, God's Son, Jesus Christ, is smiling at you at this very moment, looking you in the eye right now, and inviting you today. "Follow me," he says to you.



Facts about blood needs - how many of you have been touched in one of these ways!

- Every two seconds someone in the U.S. needs blood.
- More than 41,000 blood donations are needed every day.
- A total of 30 million blood components are transfused each year in the U.S.
- The average red blood cell transfusion is approximately 3 pints.
- The blood type most often requested by hospitals is Type O.
- The blood used in an emergency is already on the shelves before the event occurs.
- More than 1.6 million people were diagnosed with cancer last year. Many of them will need blood, sometimes daily, during their chemotherapy treatment.
- A single car accident victim can require as many as 100 pints of blood.
