Pastor Puls' Reflection...

Dear Fellow Disciples of Jesus,

Here at Hope, we've been talking a lot recently about *discipleship* in our worship services. What does it mean for you and me to be followers of Jesus? Are we really living out our faith, and walking in the footsteps of the Savior? Do our daily lives reflect the teachings and values of Jesus?

We started off, last month, with two sermons about "**Responding To Christ's Invitation.**" We heard the amazing stories of Simon Peter and Matthew, and how they managed to leave everything behind and begin following Jesus. The challenge, for every modern-day Christian, is to consider how we are responding to Christ, and to his personal invitation to follow him.

Next, we talked about "Connecting With Christ's People." This is certainly an important aspect of being a Christian disciple for every one of us. If we're truly following Jesus, we are mixing and mingling with other Jesus-followers: building each other up, holding each other accountable, sharing each other's struggles, learning from one another. We all need to take on the challenge of intentionally and genuinely making valued connections with the people of Christ, here at Hope and wherever we may find them.

In the month ahead, we're going to be focusing on another vital aspect of Christian discipleship. It has to do with the Bible, the Word of God. When Jesus calls you to "Follow me," he is challenging you to be familiar with his words, to live by his words, and to put them into practice. Our sermons in October will explore two crucial discipleship elements: "*Learning Christ's Word,*" and "*Applying Christ's Word.*" You may be a Bible scholar, or you may know nothing at all about the Bible; but I encourage you today to ask yourself these questions.

- Does Jesus have something to say about my life?
- Am I paying enough attention to what Jesus has to say about my life?
- Am I really living out my life according to what Jesus is saying is important ... or am I letting some other voice(s) dictate what's important?
- Are my day-to-day life choices in sync with what I know about God's will, and God's plan for my life?

Join us for worship each weekend in October! I promise you that we'll give you a lot to think about, and some strong principles to live by. God bless you in your discipleship journey this month! In Christ,


