SCHOLARSHIPS FOR CARE MANAGEMENT THROUGH LUTHERAN SERVICES CAROLINAS

Care management services are increasingly important in helping seniors find the support they need to age in place or remain at home. Funding to offset the cost of professional geriatric care management services is now available.


Lutheran Services Carolinas (LSC) has allocated \$4,300 in grant funds that have been designated to help seniors living in the counties of Wake, Durham, Johnston, Orange, and Harnett. Care management services are offered for an hourly rate to those 60 and older, and scholarship money is available on a sliding scale basis.
