

# PASTOR PULS' REFLECTION...KEEP GROWING

As a youngster growing up in a Lutheran congregation, I spent most of my Wednesday nights at church. In all honesty, I'd probably rather have been outside playing basketball. Looking back, though, I am deeply grateful for the foundational Christian learning that took place in my life in those years. I've never really learned to be a good basketball player, but I did learn a lot about the basics of the Christian faith.

I learned to listen to the voice of God, as I read my Bible. I learned to recognize the power of the Spirit, at work in the Sacraments of the church. I learned to not only recite the articles of faith that make up the basis of our Lutheran belief system, but to think them through and to appreciate them. I learned that being a Christian is not so much about gaining head knowledge, but more about holding the Bible's sacred truths in my heart and applying them in my day-to-day living. Those precious lessons learned are still serving me well, all these years later!

Throughout the month of March at Hope, we will be doing something similar during our worship services. We'll be taking some time to explore the foundational truths of our faith, as expressed in the Apostles' Creed. Our sermons at the weekend services, and on Wednesday nights, are answering the question, "Why Believe?" We'll be talking about the Biblical basis for why we believe what we believe. Instead of just saying the words over and over again, let's delve into the meaning they have for our hearts, and the application they have for our living.

# THRIVENT FINANCIAL UPDATE

In 2014 The Capital NC Chapter of Thrivent Financial approved **ten** Fundraising or Hands-On Service projects totaling \$5400 for Hope Lutheran Church or its members. These projects ranged from the Golf tournament to supporting the Guatemala Mission Trip, to landscaping support for the church, or fundraisers for youth activities.

2015 is a transition year as Thrivent Financial is moving away from the Local Chapter Boards to approve projects to individual Action Teams that interface directly with Thrivent Financial. The money allocation that the Capital NC Chapter received for 2015 was significantly reduced for Care Abounds in Communities Hands-On and Fundraising Projects. Next year it will likely go to zero.

Various pilot studies in other Thrivent regions has shown that the Action Team concept to be very successful. Each Thrivent member can sponsor two Action Teams per year. Everything is handled on-line directly with Thrivent Financial. Once a Thrivent member identifies a need that they would like to address, either in their church or community and has formed a team to address the need, they can log in to the Thrivent website and identify what they want to do.

Thrivent will provide approval within a week and then send support materials to include a DEBIT card for \$250 as seed money to get the project underway. Projects have to be completed within 90 days. Thrivent members will need to have their Thrivent member number when applying for action team approval. More information on Action Teams can be found on-line at Thrivent/Action Teams. Thrivent members can apply right away during this transition year. Additional information can be obtained from Hope member, Hugh McAlear, 919-554-9081, who is presently on the Capital NC Chapter Board.
