WHAT'S IN A NAME?

JOE: Hey, you're a Lutheran, aren't you?

JOHN: Yeah, sure! I go to Hope Lutheran Church on Rogers Road.

JOE: So, what's a 'Lutheran,' anyway?

JOHN: Well, ... (long pause) ... Hmm, ... (longer pause) ... Uh, ... (really awkward pause)

Has that ever happened to you? What would your answer be?

While there's not any one correct answer, there are some important responses to keep in mind.

- Lutheran' definitely doesn't mean a person who worships Martin Luther. We worship God alone, the Triune God revealed in the Bible. Martin Luther was a wonderful theologian and an excellent church leader, but he was also a flawed, sinful human being. Back in the 1500's, people coined the term 'Lutheran' to make fun of Luther's followers, implying that they were no longer Christians, but worshippers of Luther. Not so! Lutherans only worship God the Father, Son, and Holy Spirit.
- Lutheran' certainly doesn't mean 'German,' either. Martin Luther hailed from Germany, and many modern-day Lutherans come from a German heritage (including yours truly); but Lutherans are found all over the world. In fact, the country with the largest church-going Lutheran population these days is Ethiopia!
- Lutheran' definitely does mean that we are a church that is Bible-based, and Bible-centered. Last month, I literally stood up on a Bible in front of our first-year confirmation students, to get across the point that our church has only one foundation. And that is the Word of God! Our preaching and teaching, our worship life and congregational structure, our beliefs and doctrines are all solidly based on Scripture. That's a big part of what it means to be 'Lutheran.'
- Lutheran' also positively means that we are Christians who rely on Jesus for our salvation. We know we can't earn or work our way into heaven. God wants you and me to clean up our act, and to put our faith and love into action every day. But when it comes to our salvation, Lutherans say it loud and clear (because the Bible says it loud and clear), "We are saved by God's grace, through faith in Jesus Christ!"

This month at Hope, we'll explore in our "Lutheran Words" sermon series some other key responses to the question, "What's a 'Lutheran'?" I look forward to seeing you in church! God bless and keep you always!

2015 GUATEMALA TRIP

The 2015 Guatemala Team returned from a rewarding weeklong trip to Guatemala Saturday, September 12, 2015. We had eleven Hope members on the trip, including four impressive teenagers. All of us were touched by the faithfulness of the Guatemalans living under some very difficult conditions.


Guatemala Groundwork is a mission that hosts groups like ours throughout the year. Our days were very busy, starting by attending the Missions' daily morning devotion conducted by the very faithful Guatemalans that work there. We then travelled to different areas and visited many Guatemalans in their homes, who were always very happy to see us. We were able to see both urban and rural life in Guatemala. After lunch we had the privilege to perform a skit in front of hundreds of Guatemalan children, with interpreters of course.

Kim Nugent put the skit together about Moses leading the grumbling Israelites to Mt. Sinai to a rock that God had produce water for them. This and additional interaction with the children was most rewarding. After travelling

back to the house, we had dinner and then had another devotion amongst ourselves. Additionally we had the opportunity to attend a church service, which was a bit longer than ours, and we got to play the Guatemalans in basketball, which we lost.

Many on the team have made previous trips and have been sponsoring children for some time. Without this sponsorship, the children would probably not be able to attend school. These members got to spend time to visit with their children, which was rewarding and touching to see.

The responsibility for financing the trip belongs to each team member. We thank God for those who donated money specifically for the trip and those who supported our fundraisers to help offset the cost. Because of generous donations we were able to take school supplies, shoes, vitamins for children and quilts provided by our Seam Team that the Missionaries give to the elderly and single mothers. We thank God for the members who have the desire and time to participate, for safety, for fellowship and for Mark Slaybaugh for leading the team over many months of preparation for the trip. PRESCHOOL OUTREACH & SERVICE


