

"Do you not know that all of us who have been baptized into Christ Jesus were baptized into his death? We were buried therefore with him by baptism into death, in order that, just as Christ was raised from the dead by the glory of the Father, we too might walk in newness of life" (Rom. 6:34).



YOUTH MINISTRY CALL TEAM

The members of Hope shared a very fond farewell with DCE Krista Young last month. As we pray for God to bless and guide Krista in her new areas of ministry service as a missionary, we also pray that the Lord will lead our church to a wonderful new youth ministry leader.

Members of the Youth Ministry Call Team are Letitia Siderio, Beth Theiss, Angela Whitted, DCE Beth Agner, Pastor Lew Upchurch, and Pastor Wayne Puls. This group is responsible for reviewing and interviewing candidates for the youth ministry position at Hope, and for making recommendations to the congregation.

Two basic approaches are currently under consideration:

- The Call Team is reviewing several individuals who are currently serving in youth ministry positions at other congregations. These "called" church workers are typically DCE's (Director of Christian Education), but may also be pastors or other LCMS workers. Names of candidates are being suggested by a variety of sources, including the Southeastern District LCMS office, LCMS universities' staff members, Hope staff, Hope congregation members, etc.
 - If the Call Team recommends one of these "called" individuals for Hope's youth ministry position, a special Congregational Assembly will be held to issue a call. Only the voting members of the congregation are authorized to issue a call. The individual receiving the call would then prayerfully consider the call, and decide whether or not to join Hope's ministry team.
- 2. The Call Team is working with the director of the DCE program at Concordia University, Texas (Austin) to review the option of having a DCE intern placed at Hope for the 2016-17 year. This individual would have completed four years of classes at Concordia, with specialized coursework in youth ministry and practical field work experience. The DCE intern would be placed at Hope for a one-year internship. Pastor Wayne Puls would serve as the intern's mentor/supervisor, with assistance from DCE Beth Agner and Pastor Lew Upchurch. If the internship goes well, and both parties are in agreement, the internship would "convert" to a called position after one year, upon a vote of the Congregational Assembly. The Call Team is currently interviewing three or more potential interns from Concordia University.

If the Call Team recommends a DCE intern for the youth ministry position at Hope, the Ministry Leadership Team and the Congregational Assembly (January 31) have authorized the Call Team to finalize the application process and arrange for placement of a DCE intern at Hope.

Additionally, if this approach is selected, Hope will also be applying for a pastoral intern (vicar) from Concordia Seminary, St. Louis, to be placed at Hope for the 2016-17 year. The vicar would serve in a variety of general pastoral ministry areas at Hope for one year only, before returning to the seminary for a final year of theological training. The reduced costs of internships (DCE intern and pastoral vicar), compared to a called staff worker, would allow this approach without adversely impacting the congregation's budget.

Members of Hope are asked to keep the Call Team, the search process, and Hope's youth ministry program in their regular prayers. Youth ministry is vitally important to the life of our congregation right now, and in our future years. Ask the Lord to lead us to the right person!
