## PASTOR PULS' REFLECTION...SUPER-STRONG!

Many years ago, I played in a charity basketball game against several members of the New York Jets pro football team. Those men were huge, and massively strong. I remember trying to box out one gigantic offensive lineman, to keep him from grabbing a rebound. I pushed against him as hard as I could, but he didn't budge. Instead, he extended his forearm gently, and sent me flying. I couldn't believe how strong that man was!

Where can we find the strength to face up to whatever it is life throws at us next? Most of us look within ourselves for strength. We rely on our own character, and we depend on our own powers and assets, most of the time. The Bible teaches us, though, that our strength can come from the Lord. Paul writes in Philippians 4:13, "I can do all things through him who strengthens me."

I've met many strong people in my life. The strongest of them all, though, were not the pro athletes and the weightlifters. Even stronger were the faithful parents who were caring for a child battling cancer ... the addict's family members who drew boundaries and stopped enabling ... the folks struggling with depression who sought out help and treatment ... the single parents raising their kids the right way, despite every disadvantage ... the Christian teenagers who practiced sexual abstinence as a way of obeying God. These people are super-strong, in my view.

can through who strengthens me Philippians 4:13 God gives spiritual strength! strengthens the weak, and supports those who are tired! God enables tired, worn-out people to do what seems impossible! The Bible is full of such stories, and I have seen God's power at work in the lives of many people, including the folks I mentioned above.

How can you tap into God's strength? Join us for a special sermon series at Hope this month, starting on April 9-10. We'll be exploring God's promises of strength, and we'll learn how God can make you strong enough to face your life's challenges. Start praying about the areas of your life where you could use God's help and strength!

What makes a person strong? It's the ability to face up to life's difficulties, challenges, and temptations. It's the capacity to hang in there, to persevere, to keep doing what is right. Being strong isn't the same as being perfect. Even the super-strong people I described above had their moments of weakness, and they faltered now and then. We all do.

## SPRING PAGEANT - IN THE BIG INNING!


#### Friday, April 8 at 7:00PM


