


# Rogers Rd Construction Project

Beginning June 13, 2016


The Town of Wake Forest has been gearing up for a major bridge/road renovation project.

Rogers Road will be widened, and the bridge over Smith Creek will be replaced. This construction project is scheduled to begin June 13, and is projected to wrap up by the end of October. During this time, the Rogers Road entrance to Hope Lutheran Church and Preschool will be closed. Please use the Trentini Ave. entrance, located off Heritage Lake Road.
