
- We are doing our very best to stand by the authority of Scripture, in an age when the concept of divine authority is constantly challenged.

Reformation 500

On October 31, 2017, a young monk named Martin Luther posted a statement of theological concerns for public viewing. A remarkable series of events followed, and the history of the world was changed. This month we commemorate the 500th anniversary of the start of the Protestant Reformation. Around the globe, Lutherans and other Christians are celebrating this milestone in a myriad of ways. Here's what's happening at Hope Lutheran Church.

Adult Education

"Grace alone, through faith alone, on the basis of Scripture alone" summarized the Reformer's basic theological principles, and forms an outline of what Lutherans believe, teach, and confess. A Sunday morning adult education class will explore these three "solas" as a supplement to our October sermon series.

Hope's anniversary focus will culminate with festival worship services on October 28-29.
