PASTOR PULS' REFLECTION...WHOSE HANDS ARE YOU IN?

I came across this little devotional piece recently, and spent some time thinking about how easy it is for me to forget that my life is in God's hands. Maybe you can do the same.

A tennis racket is pretty much useless in my hands. In Serena Williams' hands, it's likely to win a championship. It depends on whose hands it's in.

Two fish and five loaves of bread in my hands is a couple of fish sandwiches. In God's hands they'll feed thousands. It depends on whose hands they're in.

Nails in my hands might produce a crooked birdhouse. In Jesus Christ's hands they produced salvation for the entire world. It depends on whose hands they're in.

Whose hands are you in? Put your concerns, worries, fears, anxieties, hopes, dreams, families, and relationships in God's hands. It definitely depends on whose hands you're in!



EXCITING NEWS FROM HOPE'S TREASURER

Back in January at the Congregational Assembly I asked the question, "Why do we give?" The answer: "We give to glorify God." This reasoning holds true for why we do ministry at Hope. Many are blessed through our ministries, therefore God is glorified! Here at Hope, our ministries are thriving. You and I, and all who attend Hope, get to share in this wonderful fellowship that also glorifies God.

I know you get this! When we donate or tithe monies and see the effect of our gifts impacting our favorite ministry, we get it! When the pastor or Ministry Leadership Team seek additional gifts in support of a ministry that excites us, we joyfully and freely give more. But not all giving can go toward our favorite ministry. Actually, our gifts and tithes support far more than our ministries. Let's face it, when our gift goes toward debt reduction or mortgage payments, giving becomes more difficult.

During the January 2018 Congregational Assembly, the MLT proposed that Hope seek gifts this year to pay off the smallest of our three capital loans. The original bridge loan obtained in 2004 was for \$421,590. Significant payments on principal took place in 2013 and 2017. Therefore, we now have \$42,472 in a dedicated fund that will be applied against the loan balance. Result being, we need about \$14,000 in additional donations for the loan to be eliminated.

I remember way back during one of the earliest Capital Campaign meetings when Pastor Wagner provided some instruction: "Inspire and inform the congregation, focus on the vision of ministry, lifting up what God is doing, and will do, in the lives of people as we 'proclaim and live the Word and love of Christ." A simple theme grew out of that discussion. It would eventually inspire a small congregation to build on something that would bless and serve the interests of many unknown individuals who would one day be regular Hope attendees. More than a dozen years have gone by and today Hope has grown significantly. What inspired the building of the facilities that are now used to glorify God are the people who are now among the membership and leadership of Hope.

It would be an awesome achievement for Hope to eliminate this loan by the end of this month. That would mean we have accomplished paying this debt years ahead of time. Even though it is our smallest loan and the monthly payment will not have significant impact on our overall budget, it would be a worthy achievement and serve to glorify our Lord and Savior, even though it is not one of our ministries.

I would love to report at the July 2018 Congregational Assembly that the remaining \$14,000 was raised allowing us to eliminate the first of three loans here at Hope. This would most certainly be honored by our Lord God.
