Pastor Puls' Message...My Confession

Perhaps the title above made you think I was about to reveal something deeply personal, delicate, or shameful in this article. Not really! I certainly do have plenty of foibles and failings on my record, and I definitely am guilty of sin every day. I'm not going to unload all of that on you right now, though.

What I do want to reflect upon, in this writing, is my absolute need to make a confession of my sins ... to God. Of course, has to say about our confession ... and he already knows my record: the good, the our forgiveness. bad, and the in-between. As a child of God, however, it is crucially important that I am honest about who I am and what I've done with a deep sense of honesty, humility, (or not done). It is imperative that I acknowledge my sin before my Maker, and make a sincere, repentant confession. God In Christ, takes my sin seriously, and so must I.

My confession is important. So is yours. Everything I wrote above, about myself, applies also to you, doesn't it?

Together we, the redeemed people of Christ, have now entered the holy season of Lent in the church. We bring our sins to the cross of Jesus. We pray for healing and forgiveness. We reflect on the Lord's

suffering and death. We remember how great is the Father's love for us, that he would send his Son to die in our place, for our foibles and failings.

During Lent, our sermons at Hope will focus on Bible stories, Bible exhortations, and Bible promises about my confession, and about your confession. Join us for an in-depth exploration of our need to confess our sins, and everything that God



Puerto Rico Roof Project





Lutheran Schools Week



The cross' shape is similar to the shape of the distinctive wooden cross in our worship Sanctuary. Our life together at Hope revolves around our Word and sacrament worship, where all are welcomed, forgiven, and called to mission.

The cross' arms are open to each end, pointing the people of Hope outward. Christ commands us to "Go," so that more people make know his great love for them.
